It is with deep sadness that we announce the death of TED CLAYTON – a loved and respected classmate, colleague, hockey coach, teacher and friend to so many of you.

Ted's health had recently and rather quickly declined and he passed away of natural causes in Karori on Monday, 12 April 2021, at the age of 90. We know that Ted was pleased to see and chat with those Old Boys who were able to see him over the past few weeks at Sprott House.

Ted's connection with Wellington College began in 1943 as a third former, leaving as the School's Dux in 1947. He returned in 1953 as a long-serving teacher and careers master, and up until earlier this year, spent the past 30 years working in our Archives — that's over 70 years of Wellington College commitment and service.

Covid-19 caused the cancellation of the 99-year-old prestigious McEVEDY SHIELD Meet for only the second time in its history, the first time due to an epidemic, the second time, a pandemic.

The McEvedy Shield, was due to be held on March 2, but was postponed as a result of Covid-19 alert level 2 restrictions.

Later that same week, the principals and rectors of the four schools announced they were unable to find an alternate second date, and made the decision to cancel the event.

First held in 1922, the only other time the shield was cancelled was in 1948, as a result of a polio epidemic. 2022 sees the 100th year of McEvedy Shield so fingers crossed for that this significant event takes place.



OLD BOYS' XI FACES THE COLLEGE'S XI: On Monday, 21 January, the Wellington College Cricket Club arranged the inaugural annual 50-over match between a hugely impressive Old Boys' team against the current WCCC 1st XI team on WC's No.1. The WCOB Team included: Sammy French (Class of 2020) – Captain, Max Sargentina (Class of 2020), Jakob Vandenberg (Class of 2020), Hugh Morrison (Class of 2019), Henry Chandler (Class of 2019), Logan Malthus (Class of 2019), Ollie Petersen (Class of 2018), Jack Sargentina (Class of 2014), Andrew Fletcher (Class of 2010), Sam Buckle (Class of 1992) and Marc Ellis (Class of 1990). Coach – Robbie Kerr (Class of 1984), Manager – Scott Sargentina (Past WCCC President and Honorary Life Member of WCCC).

On Sunday, 21 February, the date marked 150 years to the day that Wellington College played its first-ever cricket match in 1871. The game was played against Crofton College, which was located in Kenya Street, Ngaio. The school closed in 1875 but the building survives as a private residence and is one of the oldest in Wellington. Sadly there is no record of the match. We can only say with certainty that Cricket was the winner.

As luck would have it, the 2021 1st XI played the first of two T20 matches against traditional rivals, Palmerston North Boys' High School. It was a fantastic victory for the 1st XI by two wickets with two balls to spare, to win the first ever Taylor Franklin Trophy game [The trophy in honour of Old Boys and Black Caps, James Franklin, Wellington College and Ross Taylor, PNBHS].

1st XI Cricket Retains Wellington Title - A terrific century from Oscar Jackson set the 1st XI up for a 110 run victory over HIBS in the final of the Premier Youth Grade. They therefore won the Bruce Murray Cup and qualified for the Gillette Cup National Tournament for the fourth consecutive year.



OBU RUGBY RETURNS TO WELLINGTON COLLEGE: Old Boys' Rugby returns to Wellington College this season with defending Jubilee Cup Champions Old Boys-University playing 'the old foe' Marist St Pats on Saturday, 8 May. Old Boys are encouraged to come and watch this big game with a 2.45pm kick off.

OBU has been the recent dominant Premier force in Wellington Club rugby with four Jubilee Cup wins in six years. OBU had an emphatic start to the 2021 season, defeating last year's other Jubilee Cup finalists Northern United 18-0. The partnership with Wellington College took a great step forward last year by the Premier team playing matches on the 'Quadrangular oriented Number 1' ground.

It is not just the Premiers who have been doing well, the Club's Colts side have been on top for most of the last eleven seasons. There are a good number of Old Boys who play at all levels of the Club, in recent years, more than at any other time in the Club's history. In recent times, the likes of Old Boys Wes Goosen, Tomasi Palu, Luke Campbell and the Plumtree brothers have all made valuable contributions.
